Advice Letter No. 610A

San Jose Water Company (U-168-W) (SJWC) hereby submits supplemental advice letter 610A requesting authority to make the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its service area and which are attached hereto:

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B, Article 12 of the Rules and Procedure established by the California Public Utilities Commission in Decision No. (D.) 22-06-013, dated June 2, 2022.

Purpose

By this filing, SJWC requests authorization to increase authorized ratebase by \$4,783,654 and revenue requirement by \$768,010 or 0.14% through ratebase offset for plant additions related to the Advanced Metering Infrastructure Project.

Supplement

In its review of the advice letter workpaper, Water Division found errors in the capital interest calculation and the quantity rate calculations.

SJWC's mislabeled its November 2022 and November 2023 charges as January 2022 and January 2023 charges. This in turn effected the interest calculation as it is applied at the month the charges were incurred. Changing the month therefore changed the interest calculation. Below are a summary of the changes.

Water Division also found that the quantity charges were calculated based on the total revenue requirement rather than 55% of the revenue requirement. Below are the changes from correcting the quantity charge calculation error:

Supplemental workpapers detailing the monthly project charges, supporting information for capital interest rates, and updated quantity charge calculations were provided to Water Division.

Background

On December 6, 2019, SJWC filed Application 19-12-002 (AMI Application) to request approval of cost recovery for its Advance Metering Infrastructure (AMI) project. On August 5, 2021, SJWC, Water Rate Advocates for Transparency Equity Sustainability (WRATES), and the Public Advocates Office (Cal Advocates) reached an all-party settlement on the AMI Application. The Commission issued D.22-06-013 on June 10, 2022, approving the all-party settlement in the AMI Application.

Per D.22-06-013 Ordering Paragraph 5:

“Beginning 30 days after the annual anniversary date of this decision beginning in 2023 and after each anniversary date through 2026, San Jose Water Company (SJWC) shall file a Tier 2 Advice Letter annually to include the recorded costs of deployment of the Advance Metering Infrastructure into rate base after it is made use and useful. Interest during construction will be accrued on a monthly basis at SJWC’s actual cost of debt.”

Following the schedule in the ordering paragraph would result in a rate change in early August. Because SJWC’s rates change annually on July 1 to recover the wholesale water cost increase from Valley Water, we proposed to have one rate change for the two filings, Valley Water and AMI, to become effective on July 1. Frequent rate changes are confusing to customers and difficult to handle in the billing system. Both the Water Division and Cal Advocates were agreeable to the proposal. This initial filing will cover the period of June 10, 2022, through April 30, 2024. Future annual filings will cover the 12-month period of May 1 through April 30. As of April 30, 2024, SJWC has put in service \$4,821,917 worth of capital investments. with calculated capitalized interest of \$54,635 results in total plant additions of \$4,876,552.

The AMI project is a large project that requires many components to be in place. Below is the description of the AMI project components and the amounts that have been put in service as of April 30, 2024.

AMI Data Collector Network (\$982,054):

The AMI Data Collector Network includes base stations (antennas) that collect meter data remotely from the meter endpoints, and networking equipment (router, firewalls, VPN tunnels) that send meter data to the AMI Headend System.

AMI Meters Endpoint (\$3,749,926):

Each AMI meter is connected to an endpoint that remotely transmits hourly meter reads to the AMI Data Collector Network. The older meters will be replaced, while the newer meters will be retrofitted with a new register.

AMI Headend System (\$89,938):

The AMI Headend System receives meter reads and alerts remotely through the AMI Data Collector network. The AMI Headend System is responsible for finding all smart meters deployed in the field, collecting the meter data on a defined interval, and processing alarms such as tampering, reverse flow, continuous flow, and high flow

Revenue Requirement

The capital addition is adjusted for depreciation and other standard expenses¹ for rate base offset filings resulting in a rate base increase of \$4,783,654² and revenue increase of \$768,010 or 0.14% as provided in the workpapers.

Effective Date

SJWC requests that the updated tariff sheets be effective July 1, 2024, to coincide with the rate change requested in Advice Letter 609 for the Valley Water wholesale water increases effective the same date to minimize customer confusion. The rates proposed in this filing is additive to those proposed in Advice Letter 609.

Protests and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response does not oppose the filing but presents information that may prove useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may include the following:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;

- (5) ,The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission).

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

3. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction, are installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage or waste of water and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
