WATERSHED APPRECIATION MONTH

Throughout the month of August, we celebrated our very first Watershed Appreciation Month! A watershed is an area of land that channels rainfall, snowmelt, and runoff into a common body of water. In fact, the San Francisco Bay to the Pacific Ocean is one big watershed.

Our Los Gatos Creek watershed is part of a vital ecosystem that supports numerous communities, landowners, public entities, and environmental groups. Together, we work diligently to manage and protect these lands through the Los Gatos Creek Watershed Collaboration Forest Health Project. San Jose Water manages hazardous fuels and forest health to mitigate wildfire risk, responds to fires when they occur, studies and protects local wildlife and plant species, and continuously monitors surface water quality.

PROMISEPAY PAYMENT PLANS

In partnership with Promise, we now offer PromisePay payment plans for residential and commercial customers who are behind on their water bill. The plans are a flexible and interest-free way to reduce debt while continuing to receive high-quality water service.

Through the PromisePay portal, eligible SJW customers can select a payment plan option, set up automatic payments, and receive payment reminders and other account notifications. CUSTOMERS RECEIVE STATE FUNDING TO EASE FINANCIAL HARDSHIP

San Jose Water recently received \$9.1 million from the California Water and Wastewater Arrearage Payment Program, which is administered by the State Water Resources Control Board and provided through the American Rescue Plan Act. These funds helped support

customers who experienced financial hardship due to COVID. This was the second of two payments aimed at helping customers over the past two years. In total, \$15.3 million has been received from this program.

INVESTMENT IN INFRASTRUCTURE: CAMBRIAN RESERVOIRS

San Jose Water's Cambrian Station long consisted of two large earthen embankment reservoirs with storage capacity of 12.1 million gallons and 3.9 million gallons, respectively. The first reservoir was originally constructed in 1890 and the second in 1921. Over time, both reached the end of their useful life.



Construction began in May 2024 to replace the aging infrastructure. This multi-year construction project will build two new tanks, providing 16 million gallons of potable water storage to our customers. The reservoir replacement project is scheduled to be completed in September 2027. Learn more: sjwater.com/cambrian

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
