

Watershed Appreciation Month



Throughout the month of August, SJW is celebrating our inaugural Watershed Appreciation Month! A <u>watershed</u> is an area of land that channels rainfall, snowmelt, and runoff into a common body of water. In fact, spanning from the San Francisco Bay to the Pacific Ocean, the entire Bay Area is actually one big watershed.

Our watershed (Los Gatos Creek) is part of a vital ecosystem that supports numerous communities, landowners, public entities, and environmental groups. Together, we work diligently to manage and protect these lands through the Los Gatos Creek Watershed Collaboration Forest Health Project. We recently had the privilege of hosting a watershed tour with our partners, elected officials, and members of the press to highlight the importance of our conservation initiatives. Throughout the watershed, you'll find bodies of water such as Lake Elsman, Lake Kittredge, and Lake Cozzens that are named after early SJW company presidents who played pivotal roles in the preservation of these resources. SJW's proactive approach to land management and protection is what we call

<u>environmental stewardship</u>. SJW manages hazardous fuels and forest health to mitigate wildfire risks, responds to fires when they do occur, studies and protects local wildlife and plant species, and continuously monitors surface water quality. We continuously invest in cutting-edge protection and management of our watershed. In partnership with the Santa Clara County Firesafe Council, we've deployed AI sensors to form the N5Shield™ network with the goal of extending sensor coverage to over 100,000 acres. These sensors play a crucial role in detecting and preventing wildfires, ensuring the safety and integrity of our watershed.




Third-Party Notification
